The junior boy's rugby team qualified for the KASSAA championship with a 15-12 road victory over Napanee. Although they came up short in the final, the boys showed tremendous grit until full time.

Junior girls' rugby continued their unbeaten streak in the city with a convincing 36-7 victory over Sydenham in the semi- final. In the final, the girls proved to be the class of the field in the city with an impressive 48-0 win over the Lasalle Black Knights.







The FSS Ultimate Team had a great season that brought together a mix of new and more experienced players. They competed in three tournaments at Queen's this season, culminating in a third-place finish in KASSAA. Many graduating students are planning on playing ultimate at the postsecondary level next year, and the junior students are excited to take on a leadership role on the team next season.

It's been an exciting season in the field & on the track for the Falcons this spring. There were a remarkable 85(!) students representing Frontenac at the KASSAA Championships at CaraCo Field on May 14th/15th. 35 students & 5 relay teams ended up qualifying for EOSSAA in Brockville last week. And although there are too many highlights to mention, the Falcons came away with many Top 5 finishes, including 1st place performances by Peyton Campbell (Triple Jump), Declan Cowan (Discus Throw), Leah Covert (Pole Vault), and double-first place finishes (in the 100m/200m sprints) for Riley Topping, Olivia Brassard, and Wyatt Lee. 18 individuals & 2 relay teams are competing this week in Ottawa at the East Regionals competition, where the Top 4 in each category will qualify for the OFSAA Championships at York University from June 5th - 7th. 


Social Science Department

Bring Hope to Alexa.


Alexa is an honor roll student with plans to begin University this fall with the goal to become a dentist. Alexa has two passions – family and hockey. She is proud to have played for the U18AAA Notre Dame Hounds as well as represented Team Saskatchewan National Aboriginal Hockey Championship.

In 2023, Alexa was diagnosed with Primary Myleofibrosis and will require a stem cell transplant. Each year, hundreds of patients in Canada with life threatening diseases need a stem cell transplant to save their life. For indigenous people, it is more difficult as just over 1% prospective donors are on the Canada's stem cell registry. If you are between the ages of 17-35, please consider joining.

Children and teens get many messages about health and body image. These messages can be helpful or harmful.

As parents and caregivers, it's not about being perfect with healthy behaviours and positive attitudes. It's about recognizing that you have the power to inspire and influence your child's choices.

Make being active a daily routine. Take part in physical activity to feel good and strong, and to have fun.

Help your child have a healthy relationship with food. Avoid using terms like "good food" or "bad food", these words can create judgement around food choices. Instead, call foods by their names or describe them by commenting on their colour, texture, or flavour.

Create a welcoming environment by speaking positively about all body shapes and sizes.
