National Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day

September 30th is the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day. This is a day to intentionally continue learning about the Residential School System and the truthful history of relationships between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples. This is a day to mourn the lives of the children who never came home and honour the survivors, as well as their families and communities. This day is part of a larger conversation of colonization and systemic inequities, and the recognition of Indigenous resilience and resistance to colonial tactics should be included as part of this learning.

Cell Phone Restrictions

Reducing Classroom Interruptions, Truancy and Tardiness (Lates)

The hall pass system is working well as there are fewer hallway interruptions and students are spending more time in class. We thank you for your support in this regard to improve overall attendance.

School Attendance - Every School Day Counts

The recent changes to our attendance policy have resulted in greater student engagement in the classroom and fewer distractions in the hallways. As we continue to fine-tune this system, we ask parents to accurately report their child's absences and tardiness. Our goal is to enhance communication between caregivers and the school, and to promote increased student accountability. Students embracing the new

policy has greatly reduced unexplained absences and lates. We appreciate your ongoing support and questions raised to help us make sure the policy is equitable for all students. Reporting an Absence

School Laptops for All Students

Laptop distribution is continuing. All grade 9s and most grade 10s should have a laptop by now. Students may choose to use their own device (not a cell phone) instead of the device provided by the school. Grade 11 and 12 distribution is on pause while we establish a balance between devices available in the school and student needs. We will share information about next steps as it becomes available.

Washroom Safety

Students are generally doing well making sure our washrooms are a safe place and accessible to all. A reminder that students are not permitted to congregate in washrooms. Please be reminded to use the toilet, sink, and mirror, then leave. No other activities are permitted.

This year we will not be accepting any personal cheques to pay for any school events. Fees can be paid in person in the main office using the credit/debit machine or via School Day.
